# Bible Study on Male headship & the sin of Adam

During family worship this morning, Kyra (our oldest daughter) asked a great question. "If Eve sinned, why is Adam held responsible?" Wendy and I took full advantage of the question to discuss two very important doctrines with the children. We discussed Biblical male headship and the effect of Adam's sin on all mankind. Since this is so important, I wanted to put together this Bible study to encourage the study of these very important doctrines.

### **Two Important questions:**

- 1. If Eve sinned, why is Adam held responsible?
- 2. How does Adam's sin affect me?

### Adam held responsible:

Begin by reading <i>Genesis 2:15-3:24</i>		
According to <i>Genesis 2:16</i> who did the LORD God command?		
If we take the order of <i>Genesis 2</i> to be chronological, was Eve created when God commanded the man?		
According to <i>Genesis 2:24</i> when a man and woman are joined together they become		
According to <i>Genesis 3:9</i> who did the LORD God call to?		
Here we clearly see that God commanded the man. We see that man and woman are seen by God as 'one flesh'. Therefore, God sees a married couple as one.		
Read 1 Timothy 2:11-15.		
Paul is giving Timothy (and us) instructions for corporate worship with a local church.		
Who is to teach when the church is gathered together? Men or women?		
For a woman to teach men is for her to <i>usurp authority</i> over the		
Webster's 1828 Dictionary [K-Z] usurp To seize and hold in possession by force or without right; as, to usurp a throne; to usurp the prerogatives of the crown; to usurp power. To usurp the right of a patron, is to oust or dispossess him.		
Paul gives two reasons for a man having authority over his wife.		
1 Timothy 2:13 Adam was, then Eve.		

Since Adam was created first, he is the head.		
According to 1 Timothy 2:14 the woman was, but Adam was not.		
Read 2 Corinthians 11:3		
Webster's 1828 Dictionary [A-J] beguiled Deluded; imposed on; misled by craft; eluded by stratagem; passed pleasingly. For this reason, we see that Adam is first and was not deceived therefore as the head of his family, he is held responsible for the sin of him and his wife.  Read 1 Timothy 2:15.		
Notice the PRONOUN change in this verse.		
Who shall be saved in childbearing? This refers to Eve.		
Remember that God promised that the seed of the woman would bruise the serpent's head? <i>Genesis</i> 3:15.		
God graciously promised Eve a redeemer who would be born without the need of a man. If women would continue in faith and charity and holiness with sobriety God would bring forth his promise. Through a woman, Mary, God brought forth the redeemer.		
Read 1 Corinthians 11:3		
The head of the woman is the		
God has a system of authority and headship. God is the head of Christ. Christ is the head of every man. The man is the head of the woman (his wife).		
An Old Testament Example of Headship:		
Read <i>Numbers 30:1-16</i>		

Notice four things here:

- 1. A man is responsible for the vow he makes.
- 2. A daughter's vow can be allowed or annulled by her father. Here we learn that an unmarried girl is under the authority of her father.
- 3. A wife's vow can be allowed or annulled by her husband. Here we learn that a woman is under the authority of her husband.
- 4. A widow or a divorced woman is not under the authority of any man.

Not only are women under the authority of their fathers and then their husbands, they are also under the protection of their fathers and their husbands. This is not oppressive authority, but protective, loving headship.

Adam is held responsible, because he directly disobeyed the commandment of God. He was the head of his family and instead of listening to God, he listened to the voice of his wife when she contradicted God's Word *Genesis 3:17* 

### Questions for discussion:

- 1. What do you think would have happened if Adam had refused to eat the fruit?
- 2. If a man is not a believer, is a woman still under the authority of her husband? (1 Corinthians 7:10-16; 1 Peter 3:1-7)
- 3. If a man is not a believer and he leads his wife and family to directly disobey God, what should she do?
- 4. What does Biblical male headship mean for a man?
- 5. What does Biblical male headship mean for a woman? (*Ephesians 5:22-33*)

Remember that God created man in the image of God but Adam lost that when he sinned, and he begat a son after his own image. receive his free gift we can be born again and bear the image of our heavenly Father. We all are born sinners because we are born from unclean Adam. However, if we trust in Christ we will be born again and the spiritual life of Christ will be given to us. We will be forgiven and cleansed. Then we will become children of God!
